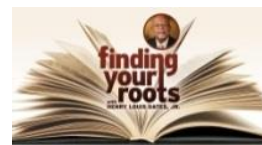
WHYY Movie Classics

Tuesday, July 1 at 8 PM: *Finding Your Roots - Fathers and Sons*

Henry Louis Gates, Jr. meets actors LeVar Burton and Wes Studi two men who grew up without their fathers. With few clues to guide him, Gates introduces them to ancestors they've never known revealing connections to key moments in history.



Tuesday, July 1 at 9 PM: *Iconic America - Our Symbols and Stories with David Rubenstein: The Statue of Liberty* – Encore

This episode reveals the evolving meaning of this symbol for a “nation of immigrants,” and how it embodies our values and our conflicts, from abolition and women’s suffrage to refugees.



Tuesday, July 1 at 10 PM: *FRONTLINE - Syria After Assad*

Frontline covers Syria’s uncertain future under Jihadist-turned-statesman Ahmad al-Sharaa. After the fall of Bashar al-Assad, Correspondent Martin Smith travels the country tracing al-Sharaa’s rise to power, and the emerging threats to the country’s stability.



Wednesday, July 2 at 8 PM: *Walking with Dinosaurs - The River Dragon*

A Spinosaurus - the world's largest ever predatory dinosaur--struggles to bring up his babies and lead his young family across one of the deadliest environments in Earth's history.

Thursday, July 3 at 10:30 PM: *Concord's Secret History* – Premiere

Unravelling a long-suppressed secret set in the birthplace of the American Revolution, where the opening shots were fired on April 19, 1775, this documentary explores a history that few people know - how slavery affected Concord and its surrounding areas.



Friday, July 4 at 8 PM: *A Capitol Fourth 2025* – Premiere

Celebrate our country's 249th birthday live from the West Lawn of the U.S. Capitol with all-star performances from pop, country, R&B, classical and Broadway artists. Saturday, July 5 at 8 PM: *Miss Fisher's Murder Mysteries - Murder Most Scandalous*

When Jack's ex-father-in-law, Deputy Commissioner George Sanderson, is implicated in the murder of a prostitute, Jack is determined to clear his name. Despite instructions from Jack not to meddle in his case Phryne decides to perfect her 'fan dance' in order to go undercover at the gentleman's club.



Sunday, July 6 at 8 PM: *Patience - The Locked Room*

A bestselling crime writer, Harry Franklin, is found dead behind locked doors. He was one of Patience's favorite writers and she is intrigued by his death and his reclusive life. Patience helps make an important breakthrough in the case.



Sunday, July 6 at 9 PM: *Grantchester on Masterpiece*

Alphy and Geordie investigate witchcraft at a home for orphaned and disadvantaged children run by Alphy's old friend. When a body is found, Alphy struggles to consider his friend as a suspect.



Monday, July 7 at 10 PM: *POV - Igualada: Refusing to Know Your Place* – Premiere

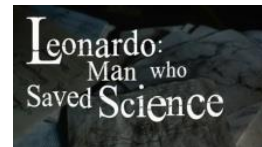
Tuesday, July 8 at 9 PM: *Renaissance - The Blood and The Beauty*— Premiere (3 parts)

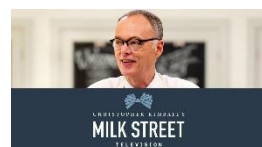
Friday, July 11 at 10 PM: *American Masters - Marcella* – Premiere

Withstanding bitter attacks, she held her ground with clarity and grace.



Wednesday, July 23 at 10 PM: *NOVA - Rise of the Mammals*

Sixty-six million years ago, an asteroid wiped out the dinosaurs in a fiery global catastrophe. An amazing new trove of fossils reveals how mammals took over, ultimately evolving into the huge array of species, including us, that rule Earth today.



Thursday, July 24 at 9:30 PM: *Gene Hackman - Star of the Silver Screen* – Premiere

This new documentary explores the remarkable career of the legendary actor Gene Hackman (1930-2025), a two-time Academy Award winner for his roles in *The French Connection* and *Unforgiven*. The documentary includes clips from his breakout role in *Bonnie and Clyde* and other notable dramas such as *The Conversation*, *Hoosiers* and *Mississippi Burning*. Tuesday, July 29 at 9 PM: *American Experience - Ruthless: Monopoly's Secret History*

Discover the fascinating and unexpected history behind America's favorite board game. Part detective story and part pop culture commentary; the film explores what makes this game - a celebration of unbridled capitalism - such an enduring favorite.



Tuesday, July 29 at 10 PM: *FRONTLINE - Remaking the Middle East: Israel vs. Iran*

How Israel ended up fighting wars in Gaza and Iran - and the U.S. role. Benjamin Netanyahu's long campaign to defeat Iran; the conflict with the Palestinians; and his difficult relations with the U.S. over peace and Iran's nuclear ambitions.
